So I gave them over to the stubbornness of their hearts, * to follow their own devices. Oh, that my people would listen to me! * that Israel would walk in my ways! I should soon subdue their enemies * and turn my hand against their foes. Those who hate the LORD would cringe before him, * and their punishment would last for ever. But Israel would I feed with the finest wheat * and satisfy him with honey from the rock.

Psalm 82

BCP p. 705

God takes his stand in the council of heaven; * he gives judgment in the midst of the gods: "How long will you judge unjustly, * and show favor to the wicked? Save the weak and the orphan; * defend the humble and needy; Rescue the weak and the poor; * deliver them from the power of the wicked. Now I say to you, 'You are gods, * and all of you children of the Most High; Nevertheless, you shall die like mortals, * and fall like any prince."" Luke 20:27-40

A Reading from the Gospel According to Luke.

Some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to him and asked him a question, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies, leaving a wife but no children, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. Now there were seven brothers; the first married, and died childless; then the second and the third married her, and so in the same way all seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had married her." Jesus said to them, "Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage; but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. Indeed they cannot die anymore, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. Now he is God not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all of them are alive."

Then some of the scribes answered, "Teacher, you have spoken well." For they no longer dared to ask him another question.
