Psalm 95

O come, let us sing unto the Lord * let us heartily rejoice in the strength of our salvation. Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving * and shew ourselves glad in him with psalms. For the Lord is a great God * and a great King above all gods. In his hand are all the corners of the earth * and the strength of the hills is his also. The sea is his, and he made it * and his hands prepared the dry land. O come, let us worship and fall down * and kneel before the Lord our Maker. For he is the Lord our God * and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand. To-day if ye will hear his voice, harden not your hearts * as in the provocation, and as in the day of temptation in the wilderness; When your fathers tempted me * proved me, and saw my works. Forty years long was I grieved with this generation, and said * It is a people that do err in their hearts, for they have not known my ways; Unto whom I sware in my wrath * that they should not enter into my rest.

Psalm 40

I waited patiently for the Lord * and he inclined unto me, and heard my calling. Burnt-offerings, and sacrifice for sin, hast thou not required * then said I, Lo, I come, In the volume of the book it is written of me, that I should fulfil thy will, O my God * I am content to do it; yea, thy law is within my heart. I have declared thy righteousness in the great congregation * lo, I will not refrain my lips, O Lord, and that thou knowest. I have not hid thy righteousness within my heart * my talk hath been of thy truth, and of thy salvation. I have not kept back thy loving mercy and truth * from the great congregation. Withdraw not thou thy mercy from me, O Lord * let thy loving-kindness and thy truth alway preserve me. For innumerable troubles are come about me; my sins have taken such hold upon me that I am not able to look up * yea, they are more in number than the hairs of my head, and my heart hath failed me. O Lord, let it be thy pleasure to deliver me * make haste, O Lord, to help me. Let them be ashamed, and confounded together, that seek after my soul to destroy it * let them be driven backward, and put to rebuke, that wish me evil. Let them be desolate, and rewarded with shame * that say unto me, Fie upon thee, fie upon thee. Let all those that seek thee be joyful and glad in thee * and let such as love thy salvation say alway, The Lord be praised. As for me, I am poor and needy * but the Lord careth for me. Thou art my helper and redeemer * make no long tarrying, O my God.

Save me, O God, for thy Name's sake * and avenge me in thy strength. Hear my prayer, O God * and hearken unto the words of my mouth. The First Lesson

Deut. 10:12-22

A Reading from the Book of Deuteronomy.

So now, O Israel, what does the LORD your God require of you? Only to fear the LORD your God, to walk in all his ways, to love him, to serve the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul, and to keep the commandments of the LORD your God and his decrees that I am commanding you today, for your own well-being. Although heaven and the heaven of heavens belong to the LORD your God, the earth with all that is in it, yet the LORD set his heart in love on your ancestors alone and chose you, their descendants after them, out of all the peoples, as it is today. Circumcise, then, the foreskin of your heart, and do not be stubborn any longer. For the LORD your God is God of gods and Lord of lords, the great God, mighty and awesome, who is not partial and takes no bribe, who executes justice for the orphan and the widow, and who loves the strangers, providing them food and clothing. You shall also love the stranger, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt. You shall fear the LORD your God; him alone you shall worship; to him you shall hold fast, and by his name you shall swear. He is your praise; he is your God, who has done for you these great and awesome things that your own eyes have seen. Your ancestors went down to Egypt seventy persons; and now the LORD your God has made you as numerous as the stars in heaven.

14. A Song of Penitence

Prayer of Manasseh 1-2, 4, 6-7, 11-15

O Lord and Ruler of the hosts of heaven, * God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and of all their righteous offspring: You made the heavens and the earth, * with all their vast array. All things quake with fear at your presence; * they tremble because of your power. But your merciful promise is beyond all measure; * it surpasses all that our minds can fathom. O Lord, you are full of compassion, * long-suffering, and abounding in mercy. You hold back your hand; * you do not punish as we deserve. In your great goodness, Lord, you have promised forgiveness to sinners, * that they may repent of their sin and be saved. And now, O Lord, I bend the knee of my heart, * and make my appeal, sure of your gracious goodness. I have sinned, O Lord, I have sinned, * and I know my wickedness only too well. Therefore I make this prayer to you: * Forgive me, Lord, forgive me. Do not let me perish in my sin, * nor condemn me to the depths of the earth. Unworthy as I am, you will save me, in accordance with your great mercy, * and I will praise you without ceasing all the days of my life. The Second Lesson

Heb. 4:11-16

A Reading from the Book of Hebrews.

Let us therefore make every effort to enter that rest, so that no one may fall through such disobedience as theirs. Indeed, the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing until it divides soul from spirit, joints from marrow; it is able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart. And before him no creature is hidden, but all are naked and laid bare to the eyes of the one to whom we must render an account. Since, then, we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast to our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.
