and they were even hard at death's door.

So when they cried unto the Lord in their trouble *

he delivered them out of their distress.

He sent his word, and healed them *

and they were saved from their destruction.

O that men would therefore praise the Lord for his goodness * and declare the wonders that he doeth for the children of men!

That they would offer unto him the sacrifice of thanksgiving * and tell out his works with gladness!

They that go down to the sea in ships *

and occupy their business in great waters;

These men see the works of the Lord *

and his wonders in the deep.

For at his word the stormy wind ariseth *

which lifteth up the waves thereof.

They are carried up to the heaven, and down again to the deep * their soul melteth away because of the trouble.

They reel to and fro, and stagger like a drunken man * and are at their wit's end.
