### Wednesday after the Sixth Sunday of Easter: Rogation Day

*Officiant* Lord, open our lips.

*People* And our mouth shall proclaim your praise.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: \*  
as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

### Christ our Passover

*1 Cor. 5:7-8; Romans 6:9-11; 1 Cor. 15:20-22*

Alleluia.

Christ our Passover has been sacrificed for us; \*  
therefore let us keep the feast,  
Not with the old leaven, the leaven of malice and evil, \*  
but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth. Alleluia.  
Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; \*  
death no longer has dominion over him.  
The death that he died, he died to sin, once for all; \*  
but the life he lives, he lives to God.  
So also consider yourselves dead to sin, \*  
and alive to God in Jesus Christ our Lord. Alleluia.  
Christ has been raised from the dead, \*  
the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.  
For since by a man came death, \*  
by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead.  
For as in Adam all die, \*  
so also in Christ shall all be made alive. Alleluia.

### Psalm 119: Mem

**BCP p. 771**

Oh, how I love your law! \*  
all the day long it is in my mind.  
Your commandment has made me wiser than my enemies, \*  
and it is always with me.

I have more understanding than all my teachers, \*  
for your decrees are my study.  
I am wiser than the elders, \*  
because I observe your commandments.  
I restrain my feet from every evil way, \*  
that I may keep your word.  
I do not shrink from your judgments, \*  
because you yourself have taught me.  
How sweet are your words to my taste! \*  
they are sweeter than honey to my mouth.  
Through your commandments I gain understanding; \*  
therefore I hate every lying way.

**Psalm 119: Nun**

**BCP p. 772**

Your word is a lantern to my feet \*  
and a light upon my path.  
I have sworn and am determined \*  
to keep your righteous judgments.  
I am deeply troubled; \*  
preserve my life, O LORD, according to your word.  
Accept, O LORD, the willing tribute of my lips, \*  
and teach me your judgments.  
My life is always in my hand, \*  
yet I do not forget your law.  
The wicked have set a trap for me, \*  
but I have not strayed from your commandments.  
Your decrees are my inheritance for ever; \*  
truly, they are the joy of my heart.  
I have applied my heart to fulfill your statutes \*  
for ever and to the end.

**Psalm 119: Samekh**

**BCP p. 772**

I hate those who have a divided heart, \*  
but your law do I love.  
You are my refuge and shield; \*  
my hope is in your word.  
Away from me, you wicked! \*  
I will keep the commandments of my God.  
Sustain me according to your promise, that I may live, \*  
and let me not be disappointed in my hope.  
Hold me up, and I shall be safe, \*  
and my delight shall be ever in your statutes.  
You spurn all who stray from your statutes; \*  
their deceitfulness is in vain.

In your sight all the wicked of the earth are but dross; \*  
therefore I love your decrees.  
My flesh trembles with dread of you; \*  
I am afraid of your judgments.  
Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: \*  
as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

## **The Lessons**

### **The First Lesson**

**Lev. 26:27-42**

A Reading from the Book of Leviticus.

But if, despite this, you disobey me, and continue hostile to me, I will continue hostile to you in fury; I in turn will punish you myself sevenfold for your sins. You shall eat the flesh of your sons, and you shall eat the flesh of your daughters. I will destroy your high places and cut down your incense altars; I will heap your carcasses on the carcasses of your idols. I will abhor you. I will lay your cities waste, will make your sanctuaries desolate, and I will not smell your pleasing odors. I will devastate the land, so that your enemies who come to settle in it shall be appalled at it. And you I will scatter among the nations, and I will unsheathe the sword against you; your land shall be a desolation, and your cities a waste. Then the land shall enjoy its sabbath years as long as it lies desolate, while you are in the land of your enemies; then the land shall rest, and enjoy its sabbath years. As long as it lies desolate, it shall have the rest it did not have on your sabbaths when you were living on it. And as for those of you who survive, I will send faintness into their hearts in the lands of their enemies; the sound of a driven leaf shall put them to flight, and they shall flee as one flees from the sword, and they shall fall though no one pursues. They shall stumble over one another, as if to escape a sword, though no one pursues; and you shall have no power to stand against your enemies. You shall perish among the nations, and the land of your enemies shall devour you. And those of you who survive shall languish in the land of your enemies because of their iniquities; also they shall languish because of the iniquities of their ancestors.

But if they confess their iniquity and the iniquity of their ancestors, in that they committed treachery against me and, moreover, that they continued hostile to me— so that I, in turn, continued hostile to them and brought them into the land of their enemies; if then their uncircumcised heart is humbled and they make amends for their iniquity, then will I remember my covenant with Jacob; I will remember also my covenant with Isaac and also my covenant with Abraham, and I will remember the land.

### **11. The Third Song of Isaiah**

*Isaiah 60:1-3, 11a, 14c, 18-19*

Arise, shine, for your light has come, \*  
and the glory of the Lord has dawned upon you.  
For behold, darkness covers the land; \*  
deep gloom enshrouds the peoples.

But over you the Lord will rise, \*  
and his glory will appear upon you.  
Nations will stream to your light, \*  
and kings to the brightness of your dawning.

by day or night they will never be shut.  
They will call you, The City of the Lord, \*  
The Zion of the Holy One of Israel.  
Violence will no more be heard in your land, \*  
ruin or destruction within your borders.  
You will call your walls, Salvation, \*

The sun will no more be your light by day; \*  
by night you will not need the brightness of the moon.  
The Lord will be your everlasting light, \*  
and your God will be your glory.

A Reading from the Gospel According to Matthew.

Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them this question: "What do you think of the Messiah? Whose son is he?" They said to him, "The son of David." He said to them, "How is it then that David by the Spirit calls him Lord, saying, **☩**The Lord said to my Lord, "Sit at my right hand, until I put your enemies under your feet"? If David thus calls him Lord, how can he be his son?" No one was able to give him an answer, nor from that day did anyone dare to ask him any more questions.

**He suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried.**  
**He descended to the dead.**  
**On the third day he rose again.**  
**He ascended into heaven,  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.**  
**He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**  
**I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic Church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body,  
and the life everlasting. Amen.**
