Psalms

101

1 I will sing of mercy and justice; * to you, O Lord, will I sing praises.

2 I will strive to follow a blameless course; oh, when will you come to me? * I will walk with sincerity of heart within my house.

3 I will set no worthless thing before my eyes; * I hate the doers of evil deeds; they shall not remain with me.

and his name be blotted out in the next generation.

13 Let the wickedness of his fathers be remembered before the Lord, * and his mother's sin not be blotted out;

14 Let their sin be always before the Lord; * but let him root out their names from the earth;

15 Because he did not remember to show mercy, * but persecuted the poor and needy and sought to kill the brokenhearted.

16 He loved cursing, let it come upon him; * he took no delight in blessing, let it depart from him.

17 He put on cursing like a garment, * let it soak into his body like water and into his bones like oil;

18 Let it be to him like the cloak which he wraps around himself, * and like the belt that he wears continually.

19 Let this be the recompense from the Lord to my accusers, * and to those who speak evil against me.)

20 But you, O Lord my God, oh, deal with me according to your Name; * for your tender mercy's sake, deliver me.

21 For I am poor and needy, * and my heart is wounded within me.

22 I have faded away like a shadow when it lengthens; * I am shaken off like a locust.

23 My knees are weak through fasting, * and my flesh is wasted and gaunt.

24 I have become a reproach to them; * they see and shake their heads.

25 Help me, O Lord my God; * save me for your mercy's sake.

26 Let them know that this is your hand, * that you, O Lord, have done it.

27 They may curse, but you will bless; * let those who rise up against me be put to shame, and your servant will rejoice.

28 Let my accusers be clothed with disgrace * and wrap themselves in their shame as in a cloak.

29 I will give great thanks to the Lord with my mouth; * in the midst of the multitude will I praise him;

30 Because he stands at the right hand of the needy, * to save his life from those who would condemn him.

Reading

1 Maccabees 3:42-60

Now Judas and his brothers saw that misfortunes had increased and that the forces were encamped in their territory. They also learned what the king had commanded to be done to the people to cause their final destruction. But they said to one another, 'Let us restore the ruins of our people, and fight for our people and the sanctuary.' So the congregation assembled to be ready for battle, and to pray and ask for mercy and compassion.

Jerusalem was uninhabited like a wilderness;

not one of her children went in or out.

The sanctuary was trampled down,

and aliens held the citadel;

it was a lodging-place for the Gentiles.

Joy was taken from Jacob;

the flute and the harp ceased to play.

Then they gathered together and went to Mizpah, opposite Jerusalem, because Israel formerly had a place of prayer in Mizpah. They fasted that day, put on sackcloth and sprinkled ashes on their heads, and tore their clothes. And they opened the book of the law to inquire into those matters about which the Gentiles consulted the images of their gods. They also brought the vestments of the priesthood and the first fruits and the tithes, and they stirred up the nazirites<u>*</u> who had completed their days; and they cried aloud to Heaven, saying,

'What shall we do with these?

Where shall we take them?

Your sanctuary is trampled down and profaned,

and your priests mourn in humiliation.

Here the Gentiles are assembled against us to destroy us;

you know what they plot against us.

How will we be able to withstand them,

if you do not help us?'

Then they sounded the trumpets and gave a loud shout. After this Judas appointed leaders of the people, in charge of thousands and hundreds and fifties and tens. Those who were building houses, or were about to be married, or were planting a vineyard, or were faint-hearted, he told to go home again, in

accordance with the law. Then the army marched out and encamped to the south of Emmaus.

And Judas said, 'Arm yourselves and be courageous. Be ready early in the morning to fight with these Gentiles who have assembled against us to destroy us and our sanctuary. It is better for us to die in battle than to see the misfortunes of our nation and of the sanctuary. But as his will in heaven may be, so shall he do.'

Canticle 11 The Third Song of Isaiah

Arise, shine, for your light has come, * and the glory of the Lord has dawned upon you. For behold, darkness covers the land; * deep gloom enshrouds the peoples. But over you the Lord will rise, * and his glory will appear upon you. Nations will stream to your light, * and kings to the brightness of your dawning. Your gates will always be open; * by day or night they will never be shut. They will call you, The City of the Lord, * The Zion of the Holy One of Israel. Violence will no more be heard in your land, * ruin or destruction within your borders. You will call your walls, Salvation, * and all your portals, Praise. The sun will no more be your light by day; * by night you will not need the brightness of the moon. The Lord will be your everlasting light, * and your God will be your glory.

Reading

Revelation 21:9-21

Then one of the seven angels who had the seven bowls full of the seven last plagues came and said to me, 'Come, I will show you the bride, the wife of the Lamb.' And in the spirit<u>*</u> he carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God. It

has the glory of God and a radiance like a very rare jewel, like jasper, clear as crystal. It has a great, high wall with twelve gates, and at the gates twelve angels, and on the gates are inscribed the names of the twelve tribes of the Israelites; on the east three gates, on the north three gates, on the south three gates, and on the west three gates. And the wall of the city has twelve foundations, and on them are the twelve names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

The angel^{*} who talked to me had a measuring rod of gold to measure the city and its gates and walls. The city lies foursquare, its length the same as its width; and he measured the city with his rod, fifteen hundred miles;^{*} its length and width and height are equal. He also measured its wall, one hundred and forty-four cubits^{*} by human measurement, which the angel was using. The wall is built of jasper, while the city is pure gold, clear as glass. The foundations of the wall of the city are adorned with every jewel; the first was jasper, the second sapphire, the third agate, the fourth emerald, the fifth onyx, the sixth cornelian, the seventh chrysolite, the eighth beryl, the ninth topaz, the tenth chrysoprase, the eleventh jacinth, the twelfth amethyst. And the twelve gates are twelve pearls, each of the gates is a single pearl, and the street of the city is pure gold, transparent as glass.
