The First Lesson Hosea 2:14-23

A Reading from the Book of the Prophet Hosea.

Therefore, I will now allure her, and bring her into the wilderness, and speak tenderly to her.
 From there I will give her her vineyards, and make the Valley of Achor a door of hope. There
 she shall respond as in the days of her youth, as at the time when she came out of the land of
 Egypt. On that day, says the LORD, you will call me, "My husband," and no longer will you call
 me, "My Baal." For I will remove the names of the Baals from her mouth, and they shall be
 mentioned by name no more. I will make for you a covenant on that day with the wild animals,
 the birds of the air, and the creeping things of the ground; and I will abolish the bow, the sword,
 and war from the land; and I will make you lie down in safety. And I will take you for my wife
 forever; I will take you for my wife in righteousness and in justice, in steadfast love, and in
 mercy. I will take you for my wife in faithfulness; and you shall know the LORD. On that day I
 will answer, says the LORD, I will answer the heavens and they shall answer the earth; and the
 earth shall answer the grain, the wine, and the oil, and they shall answer Jezreel; and I will sow

him for myself in the land. And I will have pity on Lo-ruhamah, and I will say to Lo-ammi, “You are my people”; and he shall say, “You are my God.”

The Second Lesson Luke 5:1-11

A Reading from the Gospel According to Luke.

Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, “Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch.” Simon answered, “Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets.” When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus’ knees, saying, “Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!” For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, “Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people.” When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.
